Bilge Swill

What is it about nautical terms, seacocks, scuppers, turtleback, turkshead

I guess that our naval origin on crossing the "Pond" has entrenched a rich heritage of common every day terminology. Who knows: "getting called on the carpet"? "Cold enough to freeze the balls off a brass monkey" (It is not what you are thinking)? Coxswain? Dog watch? Grog? "Splice the main brace"? Blanket party?

It is an interesting history: Keel hauling, for such atrocities as theft or kidnapping, A naval punishment on board ships said to have originated with the Dutch but adopted by other navies during the 15th and 16th centuries. A rope was rigged from yardarm to yardarm, passing under the bottom of the ship, and the unfortunate delinquent secured to it, sometimes with lead or iron weights attached to his legs.
