



our country."

Ken Zezulka of Kenner served as a lieutenant on the USS Sam Houston (BN 609 Blue) from 1969 to 1972.

"Serving on a submarine was

dangerous during World War II, and it's still dangerous today," Zezulka said. "And the men who served on submarines in World War II were incredibly brave. This memorial (USS Golet) is a way to honor their bravery and service.

"Regardless of when you served, if you were on a submarine, it's like being a member of a fraternity," said Herman Scalan of Prairieville, who served on the USS Sea Poacher from 1953 to 1956. "And you always remember those who lost their lives while serving."
