TYC Race

A great suggestion was made to me that might help us increase participation, and at the same time make racing more fun for the less experienced sailors and boat crews, a form of Mentoring, even if for only for one or two sail events. We have all seen some boats come out with new sailors, or sailors that have not raced much, race a couple or 3 races, and we never see them out again. I suspect it has to do with frustration at how quickly the experienced racers get around the course, when the newcomers are just discovering where to go. No one likes to feel that they have no chance to compete. I would like to see some of our more experienced sailors (I know some of us old guys have been sailing for 30 plus years even if we don't look like it) jump on a boat of a newcomer, or someone who has been out a few times but doesn't have race experience. Help teach them how to efficiently sail around the course. I expect some simple instruction is all some will need to be in the hunt very soon. Please consider this worthy endeavor; I know the sailors will appreciate it.

Spring racing, who's going to finish in 2nd?
Our second Wednesday Night Spring Series is finishing up on May 1, and we are gearing up for the next 5 race series. This spring has brought us great conditions to race in, I think only one night with light fluky winds. And the competition has been fierce, with less than 18 seconds separating the 1st and 2nd place boats in 3 out of the 4 races. Kenny Lanata on Weather Witch has three 1st places and is dialed in for a series win, but any one of 5 other boats are battling for the other podium positions. (Check out the current results on-line, just remember that a DNC will be scored the number of boats racing plus one, probably an 8, not the 14 as now shown. We probably need to confirm the rule about the scoring of DNC's for a series.)

RACE COMMITTEE DUTY, we have had some great RC work, and while we always thank the committee at the end of the races they deserve more. Make sure everyone personally thanks; our PRO, Bobby Tassin, for his generous service and use of the Sunsetter; Gary Knight, always out with the Christie Lee; Dodie Jones, who has learned the RC procedures and has mentored Beth Conyers, who has also become proficient at running the races; and they have been helped by Talia Doyle and Wayne Sewing; and Sandy Stone, who has stepped up and volunteered when needed, even when he had other rides. I would also be remiss if I didn't make sure everyone knows of the contributions that past Commodore Kevin Blank lends to the running of the races. If its computer related, Kevin does it. He makes sure that the results are done properly and posted on the website, even having to do double work re-entering data when I forget to save the files properly.

Wednesday Night Spring Series, #3 Spinnaker and NonSpin Classes, starts May 8 and runs for 5 weeks, last race on June 5. Some of the Spin boats will be using this series as tune-up for the Challenge Cup. And where are our non-spinnaker boats? Steve Pierce on Risky Business needs some competition out there. I hope to see Windsome, Night Shift, Drama Queen, Second Wind, Sunset Tambre, Nellie Belle, and all others out sailing.

May Day Regatta, Saturday May 11, part of our Championship Series, come out and race three races then to the dock for a great Tammany YC event, the Blessing of the Fleet and our annual Crawfish Boil and Crawfish races.

Charter Day Regatta, Saturday May 25, part of the Championship Series, 3 races last chance for some good racing before the summer doldrums.




