The TYC Board reaffirmed their support of the current House Rules which pertain to Members, Guests, and Non-members. Specifically:

Guests: "A member **MUST ACCOMPANY GUESTS** and **CHIL-DREN.** The member is responsible for charges which guests and/ or children incur and also any damage to the property they may cause."

Rentals: Members (including Non-resident) will be allowed one free rental every 12 running months. The Member shall reimburse the Club any and all additional expenses the Club may incur as a result of their rental. This would include but not be limited to a bartender if the event is not during normal open hours, or additional bartender if required, any additional kitchen help that may be required and any clean-up expenses that may be incurred by the Club. The Member may "donate" their rental to family, friends or whomever they chose, but the Member is SOLELY responsible for the behavior of the attendees and all costs associated with the event. Commercial activities of any kind are not eligible for a "free" Member rental.

Third is our two for one drink policy on Thursday and Saturday. Effective March 1, 2019, Two for one drinks will be in effect from 5pm -7pm (1700-1900) Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. The second "free" drink may be requested after 7pm. The two for one special will not be in effect for any "Special Events". A notice will be posted when this applies.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Wednesday night racing?

Historically referred to as "beer can races" the Wednesday night race series at TYC provides a venue to get sailors out on the water, practice skills, introduce newcomers to sailing, head back to the club for burgers and down a couple of beers. Member and non member sail boat owners with general knowledge of the racing rules, are welcome to register their vessels to race.

Where do the boats race?

Races are held between the Hwy 11 and Interstate 10 bridges—the playpen. Races begin at 19:00 (7:00 pm). The course varies according to conditions.

Can anyone join in the fun?

All club members and their guests are welcome to jump on board. Our sailors don't like to leave anyone on the dock. These races are a fun introduction to sailing.

What is needed to take a ride?

Be on the pier behind the club at 17:45 (5:45 pm) on Wednesday. Speak up— tell someone you are looking for a ride. Wear soft sole, closed toe, non marking shoes and dress for the weather. There is a good bit of moving around involved in tight spaces, so give that consideration. The larger boats are very comfortable. You may prefer your personal life jacket but there is always an extra one or two available.

Is sailing experience necessary?

Not at all. This is a good introduction to the sport of sailing. It is advised to be aware of the weather conditions. While the teens may find leaning over and getting splashed great fun, it is not for everyone. There are times when the races are called off. This is a decision made by Race Committee and is often last minute. Safety first is always practiced.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS Continued

Do I need to bring anything?

If you have a preferred life jacket, please bring it with you. Your beverage of choice is a good idea. Dress for the weather! Even on balmy summer nights, a light jacket is advised. Space is limited on the boats. Keep personal belongings to a minimum.

How long are the racers on the water?

The time on the water varies. The boats are usually back to the club by 8:30. Be aware, once the skipper leaves the dock he rarely returns until the race is over. A committee boat is on the course for emergencies.

When are the burgers and beer?

Mrs. Brenda gets race reports and has her burgers hitting the grill with precision timing. Burgers and the fixings with a side dish are available for purchase. The sailors swap stories and if you have taken a ride, you get to hear first hand about the "wind that got away". Winners are announced when Race Committee has completed their scoring. Everyone is welcome to come to the club for after race burgers!

Races begin March 13!

On March 6 there will be a skippers meeting. This is a great time to meet the skippers, ask questions and perhaps arrange a ride.
