


Social Distancing When Boating

Maintain your distance at the fuel dock – and remember to wash your hands.




No rafting up – keep your distance on the water.




Entertainment


Thankfully, our club was able to have a few events before Covid 19 became a reality in our lives. Thanks to the many people that contributed photos to Spyglass.
