TYC again thanks the LPRC Regatta Committee for a \$500 donation to support TYC Junior sailing.



From the Bar

Herb and Suzy Sale have been members of Tammany Yacht Club since Guy and Pat Geller convinced them to join in the early 1990's. Both are native New Orleanians with Herb born on Carrolton Avenue and Suzy nearby in Metairie.

Suzy began her education at Ursuline Academy of New Orleans, the oldest Catholic girls' school in the U.S. Upon graduation, she remained true to her love of New Orleans and entered the Mercy Hospital School of Nursing where she earned her B.S. degree and later worked as a registered nurse. Between hospital shifts, she met Herb on a blind date arranged by her brother. To quote Suzy, "It was lust at first sight." They were married one year after that first date. Their 59 years of marriage included a telephone call from Herb announcing that he had quit his first job. Suzy was 7 months pregnant at the time, and she confesses to having had a few queasy feelings. Confidence in Herb and a nursing background helped with her adjustment. They have three children, a daughter and two sons. Their daughter is honored by a portrait that Suzy painted. It hangs in their dining area and is worth a special visit to the Sale's home, invitation required.



The day after graduating from Warren Easton High School, Herb boarded a streetcar that brought him to the New Orleans Coast Guard enlistment site. One month later he was marching at the Coast Guard training center, Cape May, New Jersey. Herb loved life in the Coast Guard with championship rowing one of the high points. Lack of federal funding and cuts in Coast Guard staffing caused Herb's transfer into the Coast Guard Reserve and a return to New Orleans. The move back to New Orleans allowed Herb to attend Tulane's School of Business and to begin employment with a small office equipment firm. After a brief stint as an employee, Herb formed his own office equipment business that quickly grew to 55 employees. His business served the needs of companies throughout New Orleans and southern Louisiana. Despite heavy workloads, Herb and Suzy kept up their interest in fishing, which began while dating. Their small skiff grew into their present fishing boat, a twin catamaran. To Suzy's recollection, they have never come home without a successful catch.

You can usually find Herb, and sometimes Suzy, at the TYC bar. A glass of red wine will get you tales of good fishing, boating and thanks to his position as former Commodore, TYC history. Suzy may be more difficult to find. Our "Thirsty Thursday" dinners grew out of Suzy's hors d'oeuvres, so you may find her in the kitchen keeping an eye on meal preparation for as many as 50 people. We are very fortunate to have Herb and Suzy as TYC members.

COOKIN' WITH TYC

Our November recipe is sent to us from Nadja Solerno-Sonnenberg.

Thank you, Nadja! Enjoy!

Growing up Italian with only just enough money for the basics, my grandmother (who lived with us) always seemed to find a way to have lots and lots of delicious food on the table every night.

I really don't know how she did it...but that woman could pull some lint out of her pocket and make dinner with it.

This dish is comfort food to me...been eating it ever since I could chew.

Incredibly easy to make and very easy on your wallet.

Ingredients
Canned Peas or Ceci (garbanzo beans)
Bacon
Onion (half a medium onion)
Ditalini Pasta
Romano or Parmesan (or both) cheese

This recipe is for one person.

Fry 3 slices of bacon until crisp. Remove from pan but DO NOT throw away the bacon lard. Chop the bacon into little pieces. In the bacon lard saute chopped onion until soft.

Add can of peas (discarding only a little of the water). If you're using Ceci, put all the juice in as well.

Lower heat and let it cook until soft...usually about 20 to 30 minutes.

Towards the end add the chopped bacon.

In the meantime cook your Ditalini Pasta until Al Dente.

Drain pasta and mix well with peas or Ceci sauce including all the juices. Just empty the whole pan into the pasta. Add grated cheese. Lots of it. Be generous!

That's it. Simple, cheap and absolutely delicious. Enjoy.


